Fiscally responsible

- As Chair of the Government Management Committee found \$373 million in tax savings including:

- Reduced Sole Source contracts. Savings - \$22.5 million.
- Core Service Review for service delivery. Savings - \$25 million.
- Collective Agreement (full and part-time workers) Savings \$150 million in the next 4 years.
- Eliminated paper news clippings, switched to electronic Savings \$170,000 annually.
- Eliminated paper pay stubs. Savings - \$300,000 annually.
- **Monies saved put to provide better services.**

Accountable

- Online posting of all purchase transactions by all City staff to create responsible spending at no extra cost.
- Open Government Committee formed to focus on how Toronto can create transparent operations to serve residents at no extra cost.
- Pod Casts created to give information on important City issues.
